


Helping credit union employees and volunteers rebuild after natural disasters strike.



Through the Disaster Relief Fund, the Foundation quickly responds when disaster strikes, harnessing the collective generosity of credit unions, individuals, and other stakeholders through raising donations that support credit union employees and volunteers who suffer unrecoverable losses.

The Foundation categorizes needs associated with disasters into three Phases:

PHASE 1

Immediate Needs

Credit union employees and volunteers can recieve assistance for immediate needs such as, but not limited to food, temporary shelter, transportation, etc..

Grants will be limited to a maximum of \$1500. Every effort will be made to provide some level of assistance to all.

PHASE 2

Longer-term Recovery Needs

After surviving the initial emergency, credit union employees or volunteers may still face long-term needs related to a disaster.

Grant criteria may be expanded to include longer-term recovery needs not fully met by insurance if funds remain.

PHASE 3

Reasonable Credit Union Operational Needs

Assistance may also be provided directly to credit unions and their support organizations to help them become and remain operational in the wake of a disaster.

Credit union needs will not be addressed until all employees, members, and volunteers have received assistance.

All applicants must complete a Disaster Relief Grant Application to be reviewed to determine that all grant criteria have been met. All grantees will be required to report to the Foundation how their grant funds were utilized.
